No reset of the shot clock	Reset to 30 seconds	Reset to 20 seconds (when at 19 seconds or less) or no reset	Reset to 20 seconds
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The ball is deflected out of bounds by a defensive player or non-shooting team when try does not contact ring/flange • Play stops for an injury, blood, or displaced lens • A charged or media timeout occurs • During team control, the defense causes a held ball and the AP arrow favors the offense • During team control, a double or simultaneous personal foul or fouls of equal gravity occur • During team control, an inadvertent whistle occurs • After an administrative technical foul by the team in control • During a throw-in or following an unsuccessful try which does not contact the ring/flange, a simultaneous held ball occurs, and the AP arrow favors the throw-in/shooting team • Out-of-bounds violation caused by simultaneous touching by opponents and AP arrow favors the offense 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is a change in team control • Team control is reestablished in the backcourt after the team has lost control of the ball • A held ball occurs, and the AP arrow favors the defense/non-shooting team • A try for goal strikes the ring/flange and the non-shooting team is first to gain control of the ball or to be awarded the ball • A single personal foul is committed by the defense/non-shooting team in the offense's/shooting team's backcourt • An administrative technical foul is assessed to the defense or when neither team has control of the ball • A single player/substitute or bench technical, an intentional, or a disqualifying foul occurs • Fouls are committed by opponents and one is intentional or disqualifying • A violation which causes a change of team control or is committed by the shooting team or by the non-shooting team in the shooting team's backcourt • An inadvertent whistle occurs when there is no player team control 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • During team control: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> § Single personal foul committed by the defense in the offense's frontcourt § An intentionally kicked or fisted ball violation is committed by the defense during team control or by the non-shooting team following a try which does not strike the ring/flange 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The shooting team, following a try which strikes the ring/flange, is first to gain control of the ball in their frontcourt • A personal foul is committed by the non-shooting team before the bonus is in effect: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> § following a try which strikes the ring/flange and remains live § during an unsuccessful field-goal or free-throw attempt that does not strike the ring/flange, but is not committed against the player in the act of shooting or an airborne shooter § during a successful field-goal or free-throw attempt and until the ball becomes live, but is not committed against the player in the act of shooting or airborne shooter • Following a try which contacts the ring/flange: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> § The non-shooting team causes the ball to be out of bounds in the shooting team's frontcourt § A simultaneous held ball occurs, and the AP arrow favors the shooting team § The non-shooting team commits an intentionally kicked or fisted ball violation in the shooting team's frontcourt
